

10 Tips to save on prescription drugs

- 1. Use generic drugs wisely**
Check with your pharmacist to confirm a switch. Contact your medical provider if your symptoms change.
- 2. Ask your medical provider to look at your formulary before prescribing**
- 3. Consider switching to a preferred or mail order pharmacy to save on some medicines**
- 4. Call your insurer to enroll in the Medicare Prescription Payment Program**

- 8. Ask your pharmacist about cash prices and discount cards** like RxAssist and GoodRx
- 9. Contact your insurer for a formulary or tiering exception**

- 10. File appeals if you disagree with your insurer's decision**
